

A couple of years ago, a dear friend introduced me to a series of mystery novels written by Louise Penny. Throughout the books, beginning with <u>Still Life</u>, Penny weaves the current mystery story together with the lives of characters in the fictional Canadian town of Three Pines and Chief Inspector Gamache who is assigned to investigate the latest crime. Throughout these books, not only is there is a stark contrast between light and darkness, but there is also an overarching theme of atonement and forgiveness. In fact, Inspector Gamache strives to live his life remembering four sentences: "I'm sorry. I was wrong. I need help. I don't know."

In a few short weeks, our church calendar will move us from the Sundays after the Epiphany into the season of Lent – a time in our church year where we focus on preparing ourselves for Easter and the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. As part of our preparation, some of us like to "give up" something, such as coffee, sweets, or chocolate for 40 days as a form of penitence or self-denial. While there is nothing wrong with doing this, this year you might instead want to consider using Inspector Gamache's four sentences as your Lenten discipline. Saying "I'm sorry" and meaning it is the repentance that Christ wants from us. Saying "I was wrong" opens the door for forgiveness. Saying "I need help" shows we are willing to admit that we are not the ones in control – that we are willing to turn our lives over to God. And, by saying "I don't know," we offer humility, which allows God to work through us.

May we all have a meaningful start to the Lenten season.


